

## **1. UDSoL & EAHRI**

The University of Dar es Salaam School of Law (UDSoL) entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the East African Human Rights Institute (EAHRI, a research and human rights institution registered in Tanzania in 2020. (See: <https://www.facebook.com/Eahumanrightsinstitute/>) on 12 April 2023.

The primary purpose of the MoU is to coordinate and develop collective efforts between the UDSoL and EAHRI to implement and monitor the activities aimed at improving the provision of human rights education and access to justice in Tanzania.

The main objectives of the MoU are: Cooperation in conducting human rights research and produce publications; Offering long and short human rights courses, including reviewing and developing a contextualized human rights teaching curriculum for all levels of education in Tanzania (formal and informal); Strengthening the Legal Aid Clinic at the UDSoL and offering contextualized short courses on providing legal aid in Tanzania; and Expanding the contribution of EAHRI and other like-minded actors in implementing human rights and access to justice activities planned and established by the UDSoL in particular.

## **2. UDSoL & FB Attorneys**

The University of Dar es Salaam School of Law (UDSoL) entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with FB Attorneys (FBA) (A Law Firm based in Dar-es-Salaam. See: <https://fbattorneys.co.tz/>) on 19<sup>th</sup> December 2022.

The main objectives of the MoU is, inter alia, to; Create a means for collaborative efforts between UDSoL and FBA, including but not limited to strengthening the provision of legal aid services and outreach programmes at UDSoL; Bridge the gap between the theoretical, practical, and professional experience of law students and graduates from UDSoL to enhance UDSMs alumni's competitiveness and employability in the job market; Widen access to legal education through scholarship opportunities for academically strong students from poor and needy families; and Improve

the quality of legal education delivery through field-based research activities and the availability of teaching and learning resources.

The MoU also seeks to; Revitalize and provide support to the legal aid activities and related outreach programmes carried out by UDSol's Legal Aid Committee; Organize or arrange career days for UDSol students, guest lectures, workshops, academic webinars, students welfare (drop-in and mentorship sessions), study tours, field placements, and internships, amongst others; Procure teaching, learning, and legal clinic tools (e.g., books, computers, laptops, tablets, printers, software, projectors, and e-resource subscriptions); Infuse new ideas, methods, and technology into the teaching and learning processes, infrastructure, and environment at UDSol; Pioneer the establishment of the UDSol Students' Scholarship Fund to assist needy undergraduate students; and Carryout joint fundraising activities and co-opting new partners.
